	Academic Reputation	Taken from the annual QS Academic Reputation Survey, designed to evaluate the perceptions of global academics on which institutions are demonstrating academic excellence. Learn more on: https://support.qs.com/hc/en-gb/articles/4405952675346	30.0%
Research and Discovery	Citations per Paper	This ratio measures the average number of citations obtained per publication, and is a proxy of the impact and quality of the scientific work done by universities. Underlying data of papers and citations is indexed by Scopus. The paper and citation counts are normalized in an attempt to equalize their influence across the five broad faculty areas.	10.0%
	Papers per Faculty	This indicator seeks to determine the average number of scientific publications (papers) produced per faculty and evaluates the productivity of research institutions. Data is extracted from Scopus. Indexed papers over a period of five years are used. The paper count is normalized, ensuring that papers published in each of the five broad faculty areas are weighted equally.	5.0%
Employability	Employer Reputation	Taken from the annual QS Employer Reputation Survey, designed to evaluate the perceptions of global employers on which institutions are providing the most job-ready graduates. More information: https://support.qs.com/hc/en-gb/articles/4407794203410	15.0%
and Outcomes	Employment Outcomes	This indicator has been crafted to reflect the ability of institutions to ensure a high level of employability for their graduates, while also nurturing future leaders who go on to make an impact in their respective fields. Learning Experience	Faculty Student Ratio	This is the ratio between the number of academic staff and number of students. Sustainability	Sustainability	The score for this component is taken from the analysis of the standalone QS Sustainability Ranking. 


Overall Score 46.2

"Net" figures are calculated after the application of affiliation caps to exclude papers (and their corresponding citations) with more than a given number of Scopus Affiliation IDs co-authoring each research paper.






# Faculty Student Ratio Faculty staff per 100 students

# Papers Per Faculty Normalised papers per faculty member




# International Students Ratio International students per 100 students




# International Faculty Ratio International faculty per 100 faculty members




# Inbound Exchange Students Ratio Inbound Exchange Students per 100 students




# Outbound Exchange Students Ratio Outbound Exchange Students per 100 students



# International Research Network Average index across 5 broad subject areas









# **Research Output Papers and Citations by Subject Area**

The following graphs provide the institution's breakdown of papers and citations by broad subject area indexed by Scopus and used in the 2025 edition of the rankings. QS considers six years of citations (2018-2023) for each of the five publication years (2018-2022).

The QS World University Rankings methodology utilizes a Citations per Faculty indicator and thus the objective of this approach is to derive a normalized total citation count. The primary goal is to simply equalize the influence of the five broad subject areas considered.
